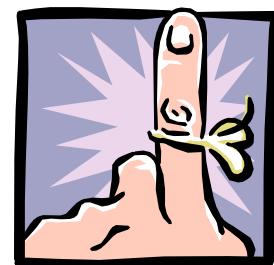
CDLC PARKING LOT

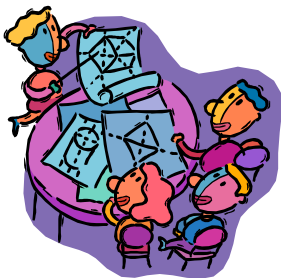

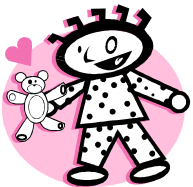

Science: Wow! It has been great the last two weeks. We have been discovering, learning and exploring things about rocks. Some classes went on rock hunts and even painted rocks. In October we will be learning about trees, leaves and seeds. We will observe what is happening to the trees outside this time of the year and hopefully, play in the leaves. We will also learn about our earth, the air, land and water.

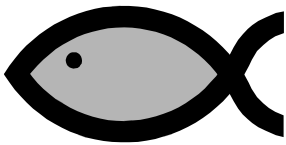


Cooking: This month we tasted red and green apples, made quesadillas with cheese and salsa, mini pizzas with crackers, fish and sticks, pop rocks in orange juice, rocky road pudding, smoothies, apples rolled in crushed graham crackers and tasted and noted the differences between grapes and raisins. Next month we will make apple cinnamon quesadillas, taste things that

are yellow, red and green while looking for seeds, make autumn pancakes, tree sandwiches, cheesy popcorn, crispy cheese chips, caramel apple O's, ice cream floats, sugar cookies, Buckle Bear sandwiches, owl eyes and decorate cookies for Halloween.



Music: In September we found that music is fun to sing, listen to and move along with. We are singing familiar songs and introducing animal nursery rhymes. We will use rhythm sticks to feel, tap and move to the steady beat of songs; and rhymes. We will be singing "Old Mc Donald", "Farmer in the Dell", "Jesus Loves Me" as well as many other songs. In October we will learn that all music has a beat. We will continue to move, tap and sing to a steady beat. We will be enjoying and singing fun Fall and Halloween songs. We will use tone blocks and wrist bells as we listen for a steady beat. We will learn about different ways we can use our voice, such as singing, talking, whispering and shouting. We will learn more nursery rhymes such as Hickory Dickory Dock, Little Miss Muffet and Humpty Dumpty. Some of our October songs are, " B-I-B-L-E," "Once I had a Pumpkin", "Twinkle, Twinkle" and "Yankee Doodle".



Christian Curriculum: This month we will talk about the Bible and Jesus. God made the land, sea and sky, including the mountains and rocks. We will also learn the story of David the Shepherd.

Our prayer each day before we start school is:

Dear Jesus,
Be with us at school today,
as we work and as we play.
Help us to be kind to our friends. Amen.

Next month we will learn that God made trees, plants and flowers and that He also made the animals. We will talk about that God made the birds that fly, the fish in the sea and that he made people. We will learn that God is a gift and the God is real.
